

TMN-COT GENERAL MEETING Wednesday, January 15, 2014 9am-12:10pm AgriLIFE[®] Extension Building Angleton, Texas

Attendance:

52 Members were in attendance for the first meeting of 2014.

President Mike Mullins called the meeting to order at 9am.

Peggy Romfh introduced our program speaker, **Jim Renfro.** His topic was "**Forest Birds Study Group – Avian Research Project Methods and Results.**" Joining Jim in his presentation was **Bill Ostrand.** Contents covered during the presentation were:

- ✓ Columbia Bottomlands
- ✓ Forest Birds Study Group (FBSG)
- ✓ Bird Banding as a Research Tool
- ✓ Project Scope & Protocol
- ✓ Findings & Conclusions
- ✓ The Field Team

FBSG is not a formal organization but is comprised of those interested in documenting the stopover of neo-tropical migrating passerines.

Banding is done 10 days per year and banding is not done if temperatures are below 40F.

Data is collected and reported to Fish and Wildlife Services and is public domain.

Jim continued with Neotropical VS Nearctic Migrants. Mortality rate is about 50% but varies from year to year.
