Marty reported that "A Taste for Nature" fundraising event sponsored by the Friends of Brazoria Wildlife Refuges will be held Oct. 9 at the Dow Academic Center to help provide matching funds for the \$160,000 grant received from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. High-end Italian wines with matching canapés will be paired at a cost of \$100 per person. The event will also have a live and silent auction.

Newsletter: Dave announced that Neal will once again resume the duties of Newsletter Editor.
