Advanced Training: Peggy Romfh announced that there are additional opportunities for additional AT credit:

<u>Migration Celebration Photo Contest:</u> Peggy and Pete Romfh will be overseeing this contest. Brochures are available. The due date to submit photos is March 18, 2016. The Center for Arts and Sciences at Brazosport College will be exhibiting some of the photos. This year there are additional photo types that may be submitted in the contest. Migration Celebration: Ed Barrios reported that the 22nd Annual Migration Celebration is April 16-17 at the San Bernard Wildlife Refuge. Many volunteers will be needed for set-up, the various events, and the clean-up. Volunteers will be need on April 15th to set-up easels and to pick up vans from Houston. On the 18th, volunteers will be needed for clean-up and to return vans. Ed informed us of the Migration Celebration Fundraising Dinner on April 8th at the River Place in Freeport. Although cooking or attending the dinner does not count towards VT hours, helping set up the easels and photos does count towards VT hours. The guest speaker at the dinner will be Kelly Drinnen, Education Specialist at Flower Garden Banks National Marine Sanctuary.

<u>Outreach</u>: Ruby Lewis announced that there are two opportunities for VT credit: <u>Saturday, February 27</u>, is Nature Day at Sea Center Texas in Lake Jackson. <u>Saturday, March 5</u>, is Brazoria Heritage Celebration in Brazoria. She announced that volunteers are needed.

<u>**Outreach:**</u> Ed Johnson and John O'Connell announced volunteer opportunities with Water Fair at the Danbury Elementary school on March 1st, 2nd, and 3rd. Volunteers will be needed to help with the five kinds of water classes. There will be training for the
