American Eel Project: John Boettiger provided a status report for the project first introduced to COT in February by guest speaker Stephen Curtis. John announced that volunteers were needed to set and then monitor two more eel-mop traps every two weeks for the next 12 months. John briefly reviewed the Scientific Method steps used in this phase of the study (see April's Chapter Newsletter).
