#### **Membership Report:** Jerry Eppner

- 53 timesheets have been turned in, 40 members have certified or recertified, and there are 6896 YTD VT hours. No Lifetime total of VT for TMN-COT was reported.
- 670 YTD AT hours were reported.
- Carol Jones, GCBO, requested exemption for meeting attendance. The board approved the exemption.

### **AISD New Program: Ed Barrios**

An ad hoc Committee was formed to plan the Master Naturalist AISD program, with Barbara Burkhardt, Ed Barrios (chair), and Ruby Lewis volunteering. Action: Ed will ask for other volunteers at general meeting. One of the tasks will be a facilities review at BEES.

#### Other Projects:

- INEOS equipment picnic tables, chairs, aquariums have been moved. Birdhouse-support poles, microscopes and supplies have not been moved.
- State meeting Ed Barrios reported that the photo easels are stored at the Refuge. This may be a problem if access is still denied due to government shutdown.
- Host Oct. meeting: Jerry Krampota will not be at the Oct. meeting. He asked for help to support Carole Wenny with the hosting tasks.



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- Joint PPCO/COT meeting at Phillips Recreation Center, tour of LEEP Mike Mullins reported that a joint meeting between the Phillips group and COT is still in planning process. A tentative date of the January meeting has been set.
- Revised dues: Mike Mullins noted that there will be a vote on revised dues at Oct. general meeting.

**Elections Report:** Barbara Burkhardt

Barbara Burkhardt reported that the Nominations Committee has heard from all existing elected officers except Ed Barrios. Marty Cornell has reported that he will not be running for Secretary in 2014. The Nominating Committee will have the slate ready for the November board meeting.

# Oct. 19th KBR Kids Day at Buffalo Bayou: Dave David Plunkett

- David Plunkett provided the board with background information about the Urban Initiative program from Fish and Wildlife. Texas Mid-coast received a grant to 'take the Refuge' to the city. The event is scheduled Oct. 19<sup>th</sup> and will involve extensive volunteer efforts from the Friends and Master Naturalist groups.
- In the country, there are five initial grants. Each selected Refuge will interact in varying ways with partners and the community to increase awareness of nature and the Refuge programs.
- The Houston area is served by five refuges: Attwater Prairie Chicken, San Bernard, Brazoria, McFaddin, Anahuac, and Trinity River. Planning is in progress to create partnerships and connections with groups such as Houston Wilderness, Buffalo Bayou Partnership, the Woods Project, and others.
- Ruby Lewis is coordinating TMN-COT volunteers for the event.
- David Plunkett is coordinating set-up for the Oct. 19<sup>th</sup> event. Action: David Plunkett will provide a map of the location of the Oct. 19<sup>th</sup> event and of parking. Mike Mullins will provide 5 10 minutes time for him at the Oct. general meeting to discuss the event and the urban initiative.
