Phil Huxford reported on the need for fundraising for the Birds of Prey Program. The plan is to expand the Birds of Prey program into Alvin Jr. High. The falconry program has continued to grow over the years. They currently serve 9 independent school districts, 32 schools, and have reached over 16,000 teachers and students. Each program costs ever \$400 per school. The programs are usually sponsored by school PTOs and individual businesses.

Chapter Host Position:

Dave Brandes, President, presented a plan to pilot changes to the Chapter Host position. The hosting of all general meetings and some of the intern classes for special functions will be coordinated with teams providing snacks. They will be responsible for insuring tables are set up and refreshments are available during the social period as well as cleaning up. One hour VT is approved for each meeting.

Emerald Ash Borer: Dave provided information on the emerald ash borer that is coming to Texas. They kill ash trees and could cause the green ash to disappear.

Migration Celebration:

Ed Barrios, State Representative, reported the 21st Annual Migration Celebration will be held April 18th & 19th with the Kickoff Dinner to be held April 10th. Approximately 30 volunteers are needed for this event. Last year 220 attended the dinner, and 1,800 attended the Saturday and Sunday events. More details will be provided next month.
