Volunteer Management System update, Jerry Eppner: We will be moving to the new VMS online system. Dave will be working with Connie Stolte, Peggy and Pete Romfh to upload historical data into the new system. Ed Barrios and Jerry Eppner will be the backup. There will be a three-hour videoconference in July, with implementation of the new system in September or October. Computer access to the internet and login is required to use the new system. The library as well as the Master Volunteer Room is available for those who do not have computer access. Members were reminded that the new system will not accept volunteer time beyond forty-five days. Also travel time to Advanced Training events will no longer be accepted, and webinar hours that can be used for certification is limited to only 4. Dave reiterated that once the system is activated it should be very easy to use.



Ruby Lewis, Outreach Coordinator reported the participation for the following programs in June and on July 4^{th, as} well as upcoming events.

June:

Library Reptile Programs:

There are twenty programs at eleven libraries. (Lake Jackson library programs are scheduled for July 15.) Participants included 1,139 children and 561 adults for a total of 1,700. There were also 23 different volunteers.

The Juneteenth 150th Anniversary at the Brazoria Civic Center:

There were 100 visitors and 8 volunteers.

Science Day at Lake Jackson Historical Museum:

A total of 226 children and 113 adults with 7 volunteers participated.

Nature Camp at Camp Mohawk County Park:

There were 32 campers and 12 volunteers.

Coastal Expo/Fishin' Fiesta in Freeport:

There were 100 visitors and 10 volunteers.
