There was a discussion about incorporating Citizen Science into the program and using master naturalist expertise to supplement scheduled speakers or to support field trips.

Dear Mr. Kyle,

The Cradle of Texas Chapter of Texas Master Naturalists (TMN-COT) is pleased to offer its support of the Green Infrastructure for Texas (GIFT) project. TMN-COT supports the restoration work and educational initiatives that align naturally with the goals and intention of the Chapter and the Texas Master Naturalist Program.

The mission of the TMN-COT is three-fold: educate ourselves, educate others in the wise use of our natural resources, and act as good stewards of our natural environment. To those ends we are actively participating in Texas Coastal Watershed Program (TCWP) wetland habitat restoration and stormwater wetland treatment projects. Over the next 12 months, we anticipate that our chapter members alone will provide over 300 hours of service and training with TCWP at an equivalent value of \$7533.00 (documented volunteer hourly rate for Texas is \$25.11 per http://www.independentsector.org/volunteer-time). We anticipate continuing our volunteer service for the life of this project (36 months).

The recognize loss of wetlands has enormous impact on plant, bird, and invertebrate populations in our natural environment. The ongoing expansion of population in Texas coastal counties with concurrent roads, buildings, and parking lots has led to more storm water runoff. Insufficient stormwater wetlands and other green infrastructure means that current runoff goes directly to storm drains and/or causes local flooding. With implementation of green infrastructure projects such as the proposed stormwater wetlands, we believe there will be significant positive outcomes to the environment.

TMN-COT expects to participate in this project as a partner organization, providing trained volunteer mentors who will guide and teach student volunteers during workdays. In addition, we expect to assist the Texas Coastal Watershed Program with plant propagation and installation as part of the restoration and throughout the duration of the project.
