

## Outreach: Brazoria Heritage Day - 2012

Brazoria Heritage Day is an annual festival organized by the Brazoria Heritage Foundation. It takes place at Foundation's building — the former Brazoria Elementary School — at 202 East Smith Street, in Brazoria. The foundation purchased the building from Columbia-Brazoria ISD after the district opened a new Elementary School to serve Brazoria. The building now houses the Foundation's offices, the Brazoria Chamber of Commerce, and two museums building — the Brazoria Heritage Museum and the Brazos Valley Railroad Museum

Brazoria Heritage Festival includes a Cattle Drive and Parade on Highway 36, outdoor exhibits and children's activities on the grounds, and indoor exhibits in the two museums. Special events include tractor, car, and gun shows.
